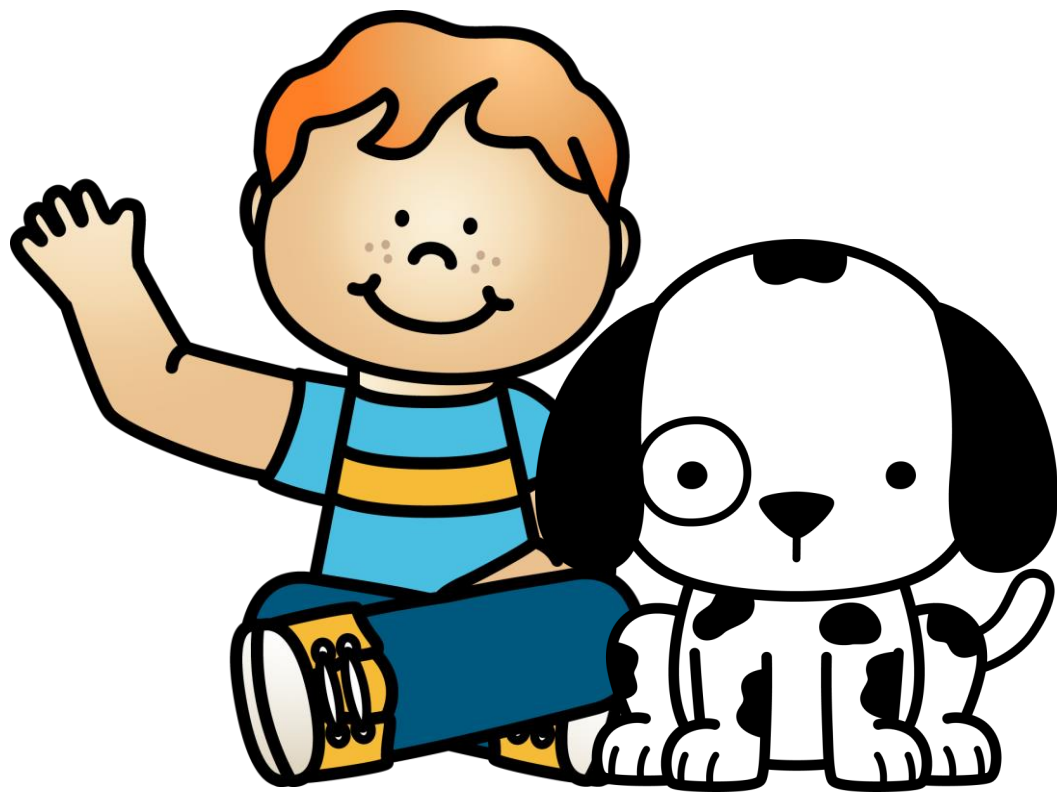
We all have important things to share. We just have to take turns. We can't all talk at once. If so, I will need earmuffs.



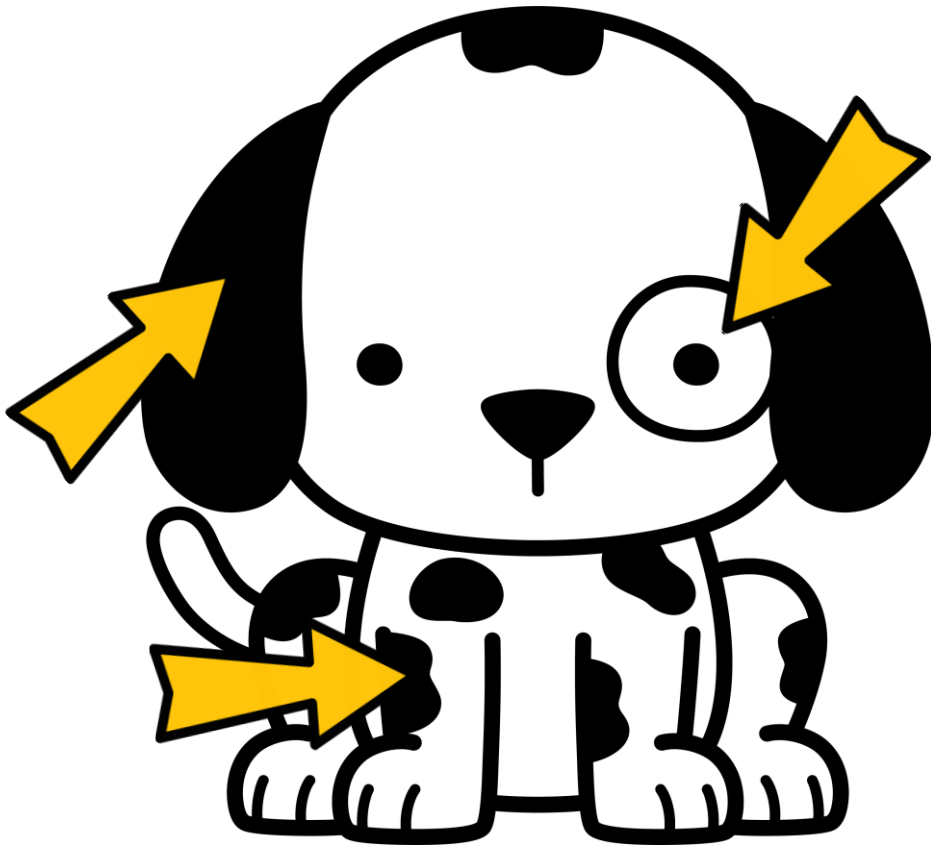
Our teacher always reminds the class, “When it’s my turn to talk, it’s your turn to listen.”



When we listen while others are talking, we are showing respect. We never want to talk over our teacher or friends.



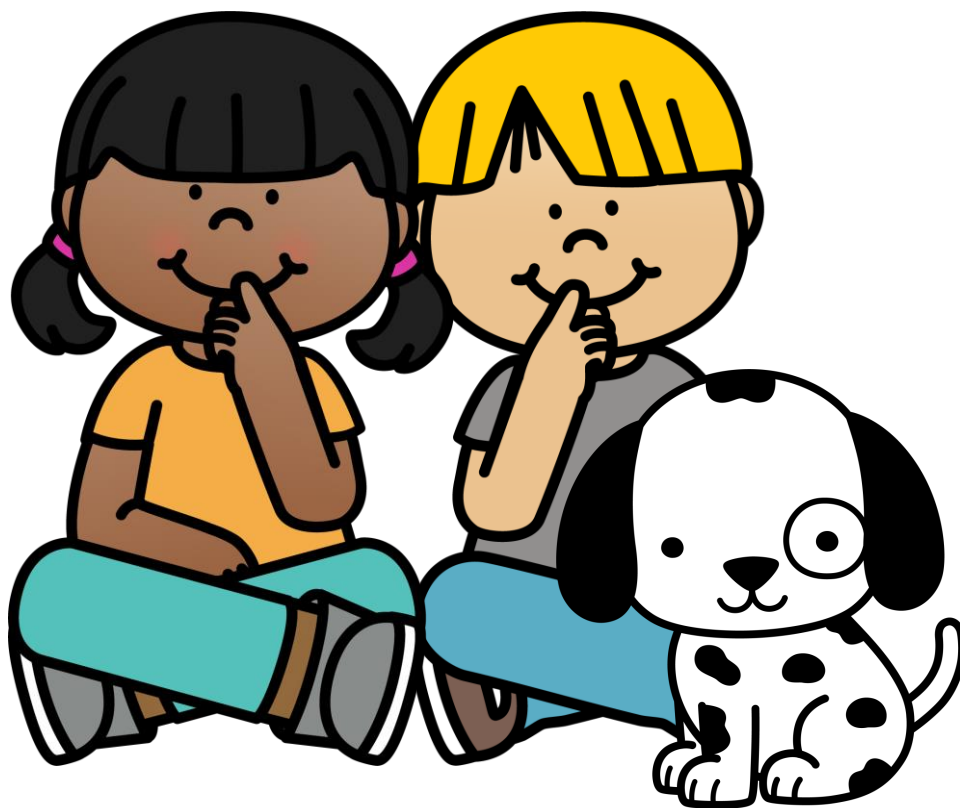
When we are ready to share, we will raise our hand high in the air. However, we must wait to be called on to speak.

respectful while waiting.**

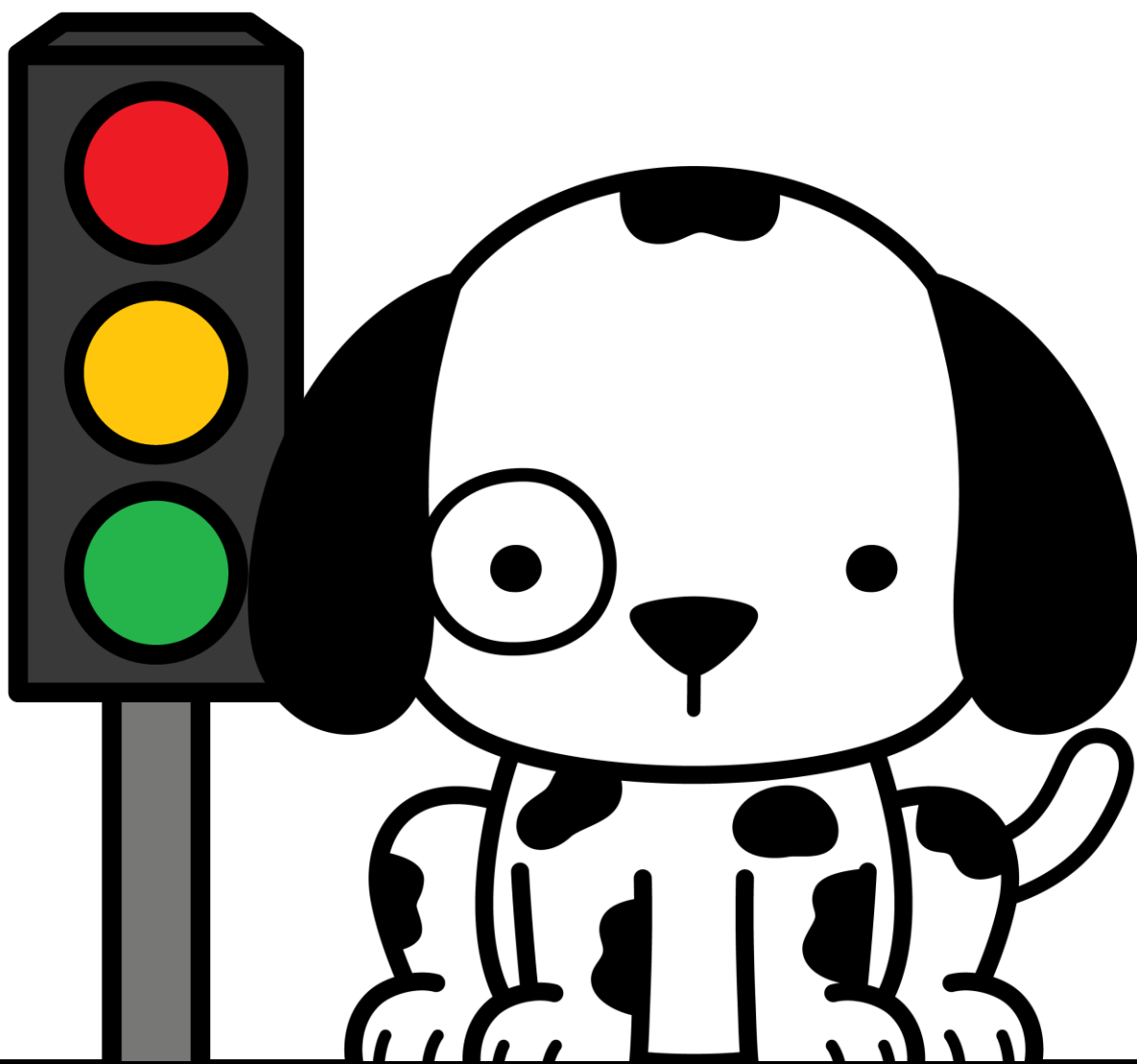

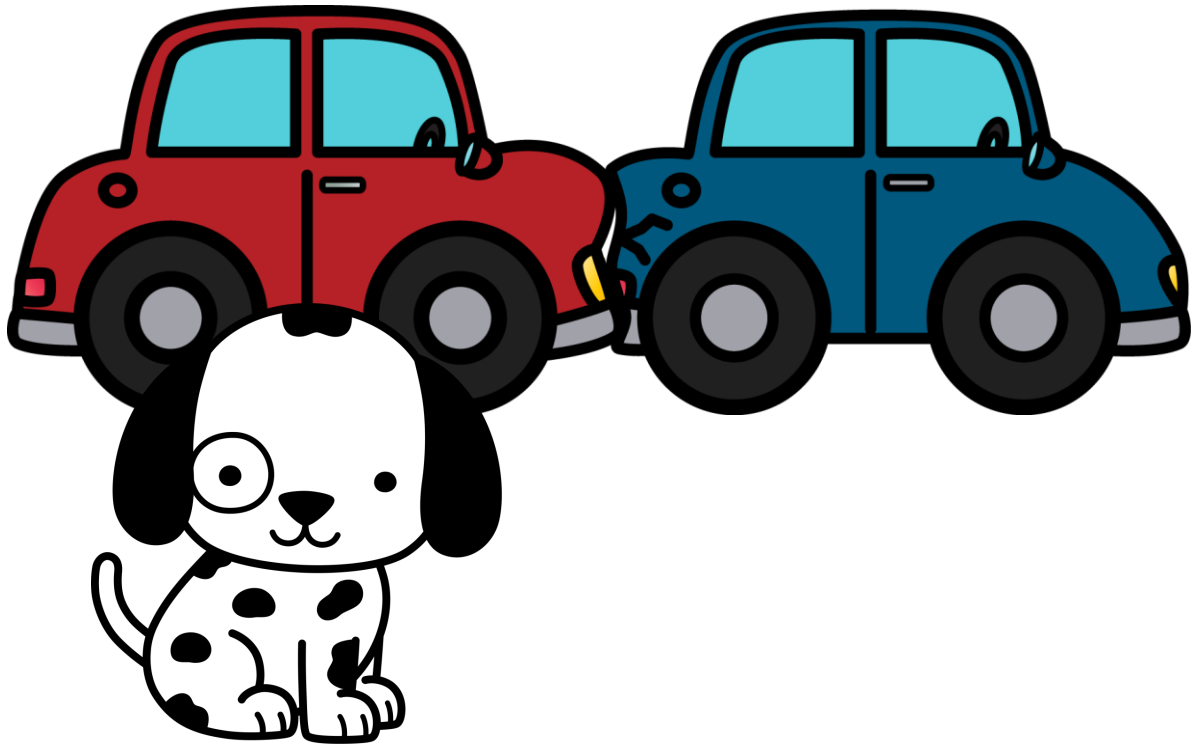




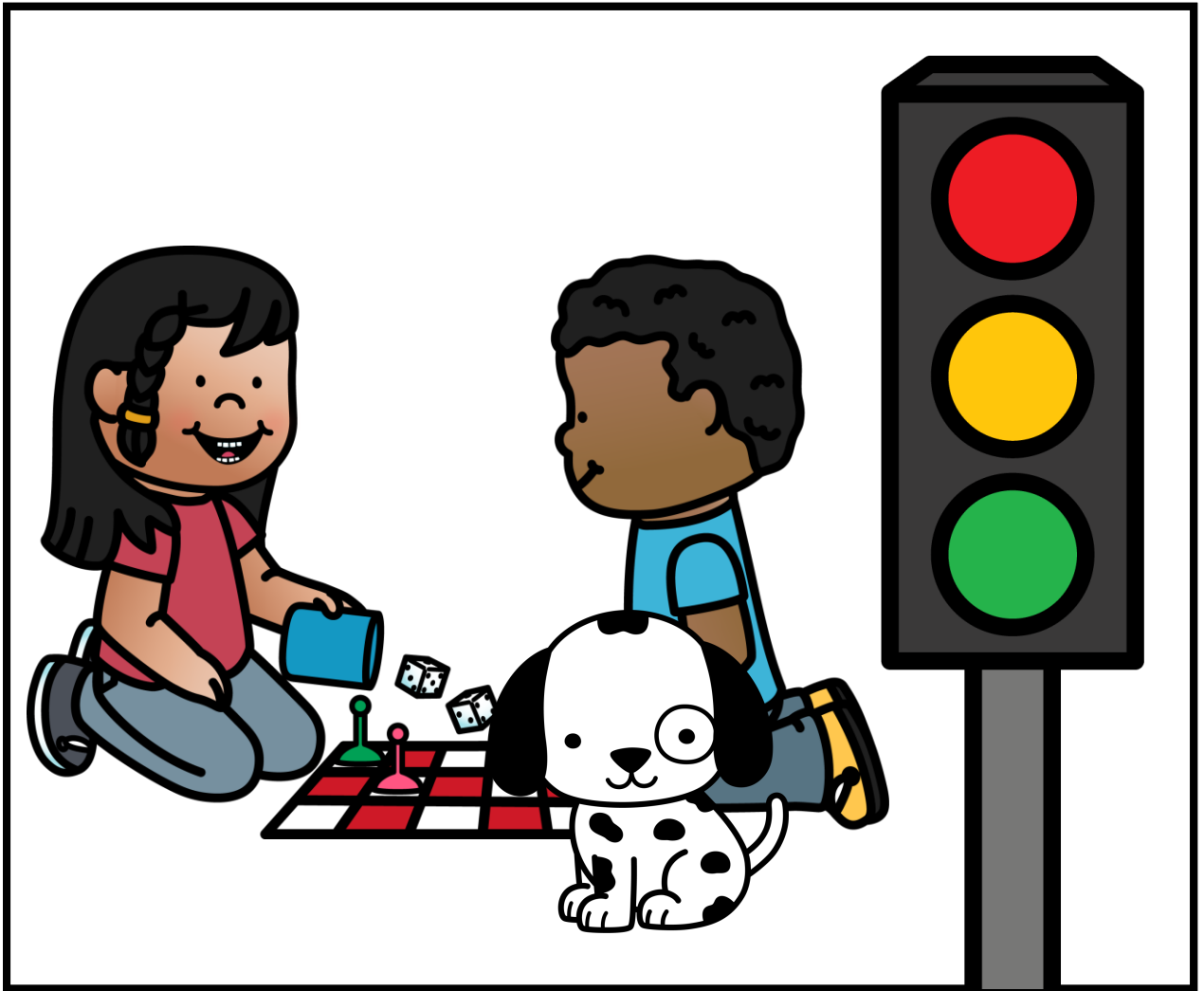
Hi, I'm Pip the Pup! Today we are learning how to stop, think, and act. This is a stoplight. Have you seen a stoplight before?



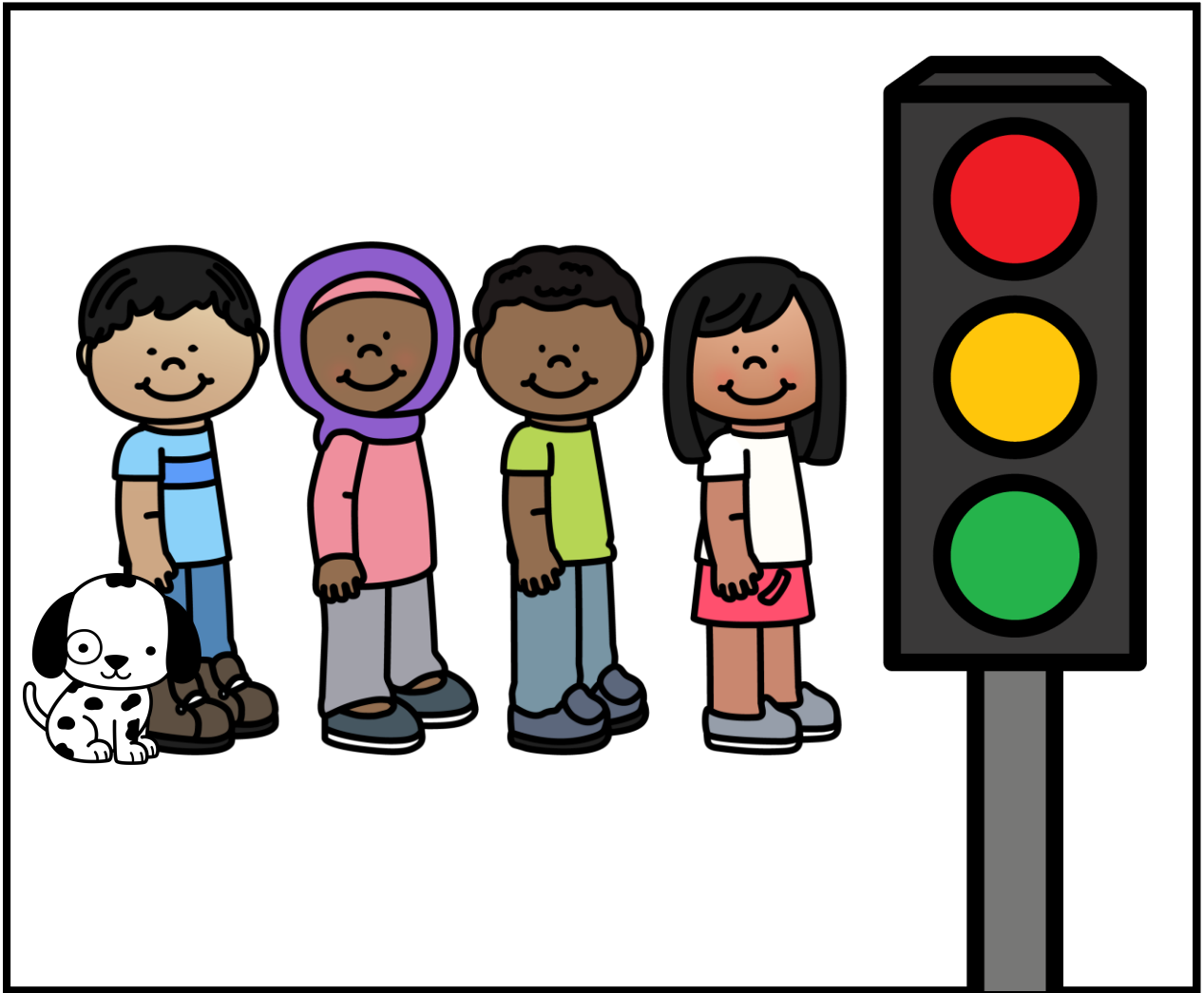
Maybe you have played red light, yellow light, green light. Maybe you have seen a stoplight while riding in a car.



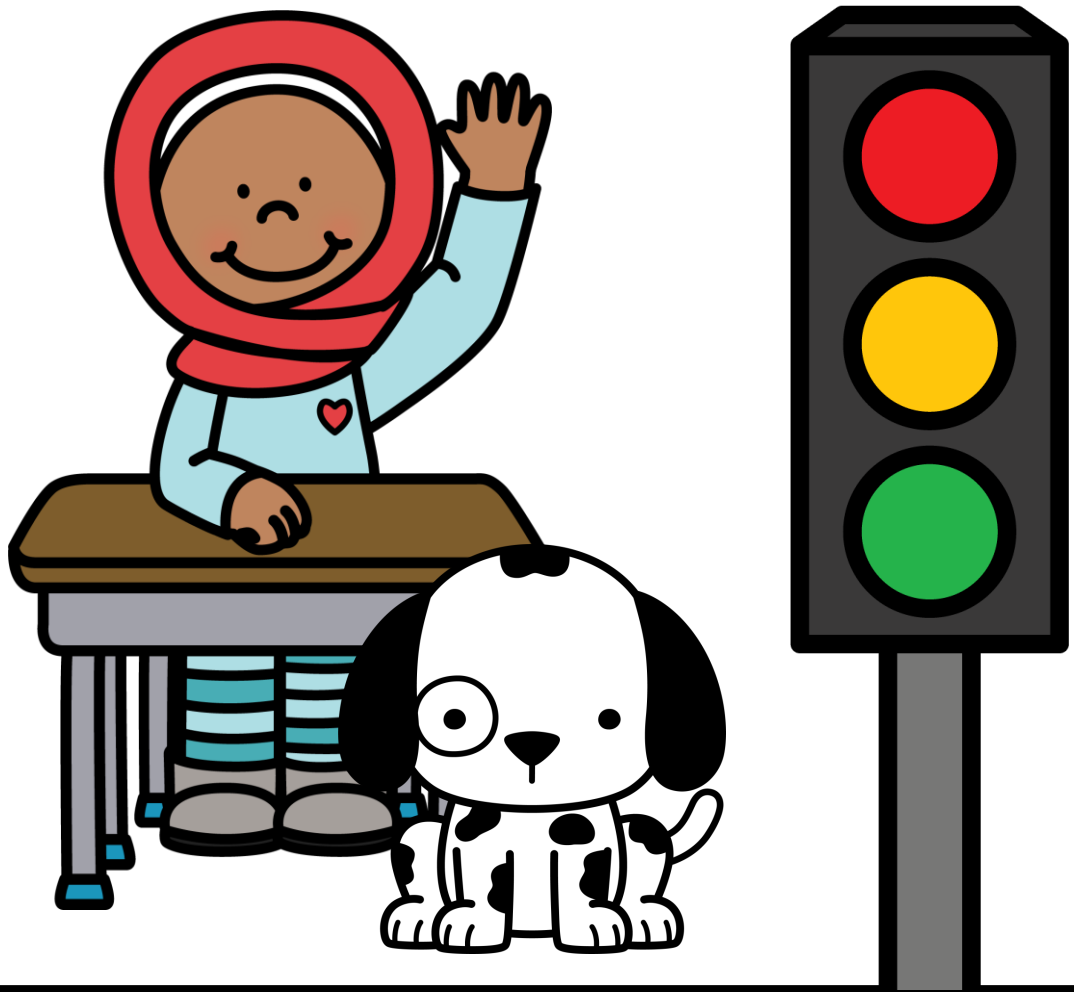
Stoplights are there to keep us safe. If cars did not stop at the red light, it would cause a crash. That would be sad.



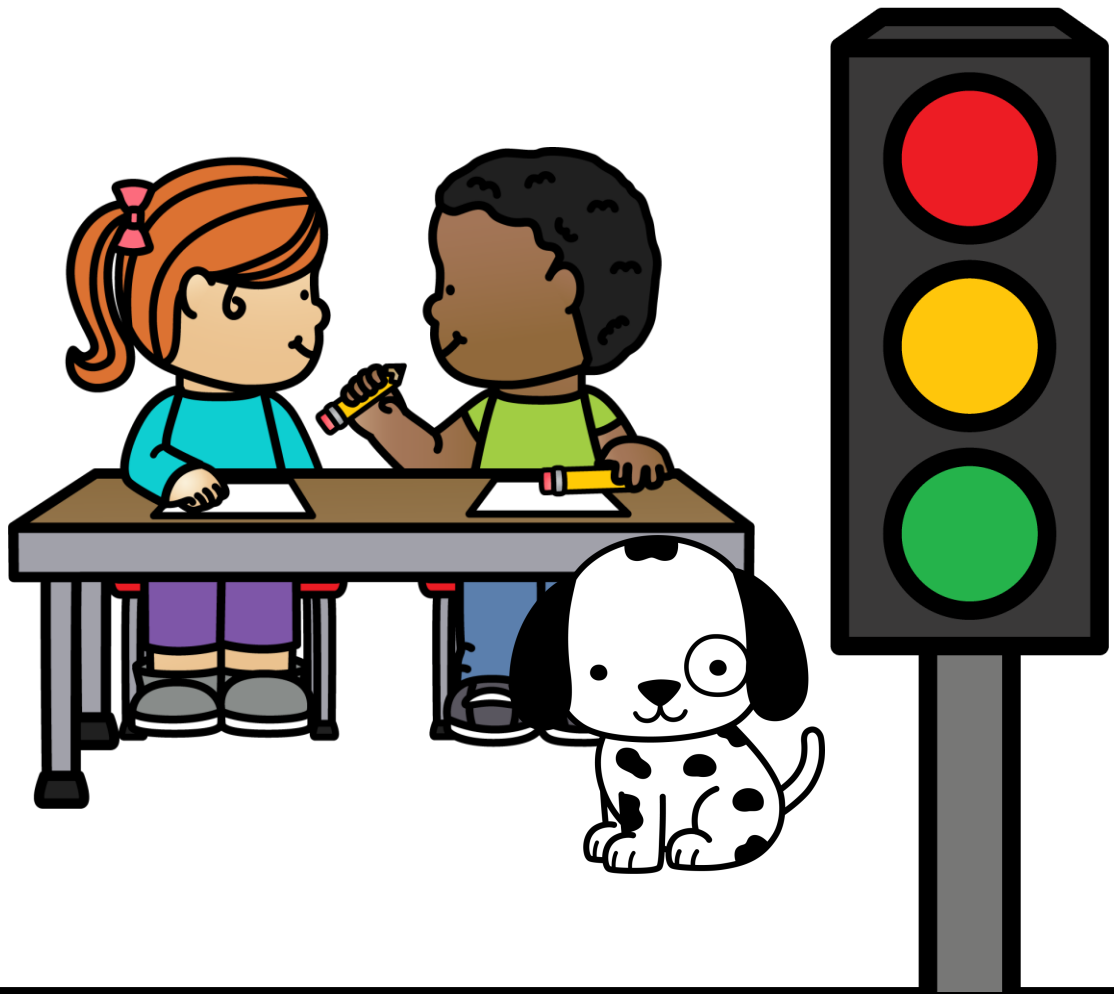
The classroom is like a busy street. We want to keep the cars moving without any crashes. Let's explore!



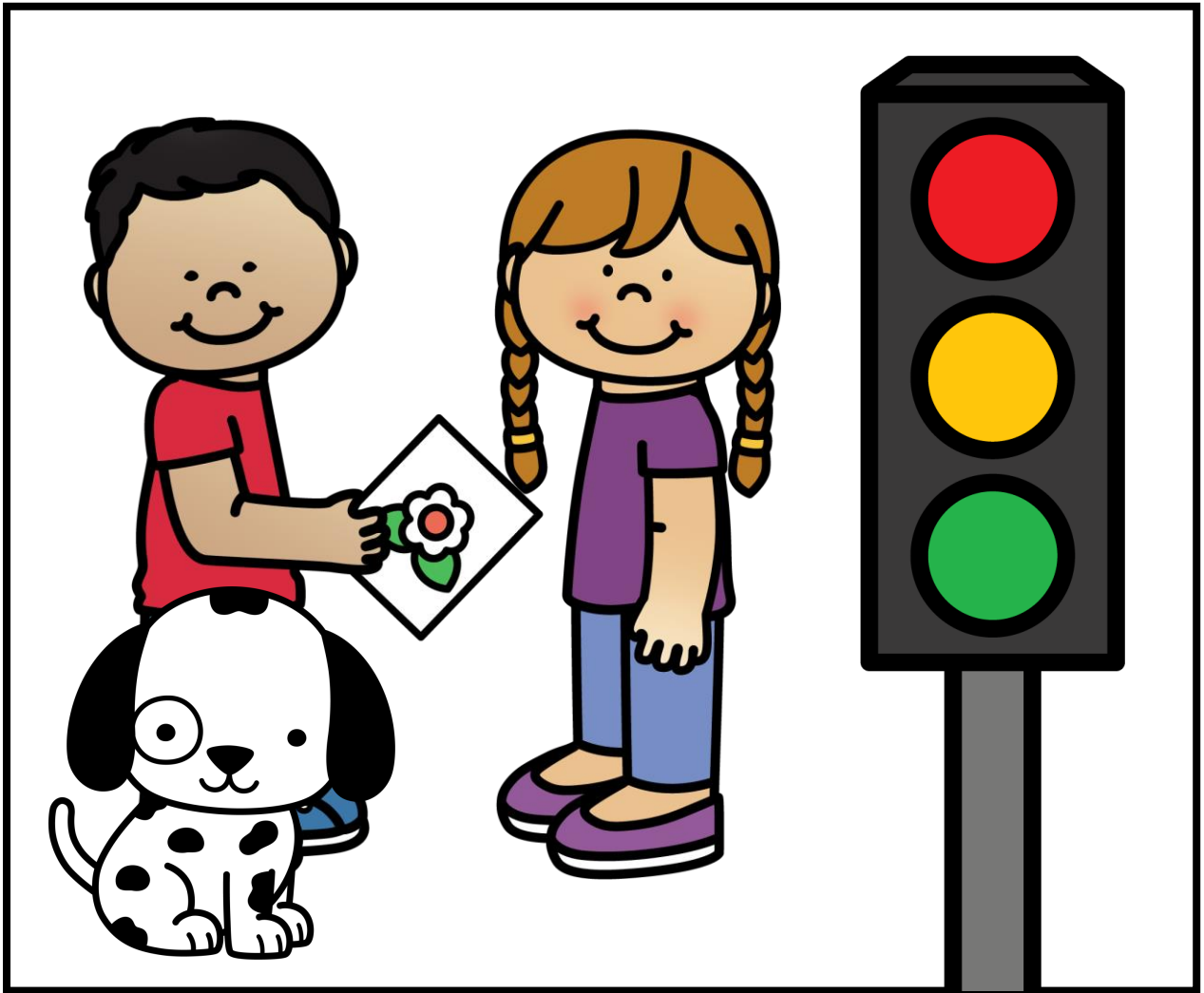
If traffic is moving smoothly, we will walk to where we need to go. We will move around the class and school safely.



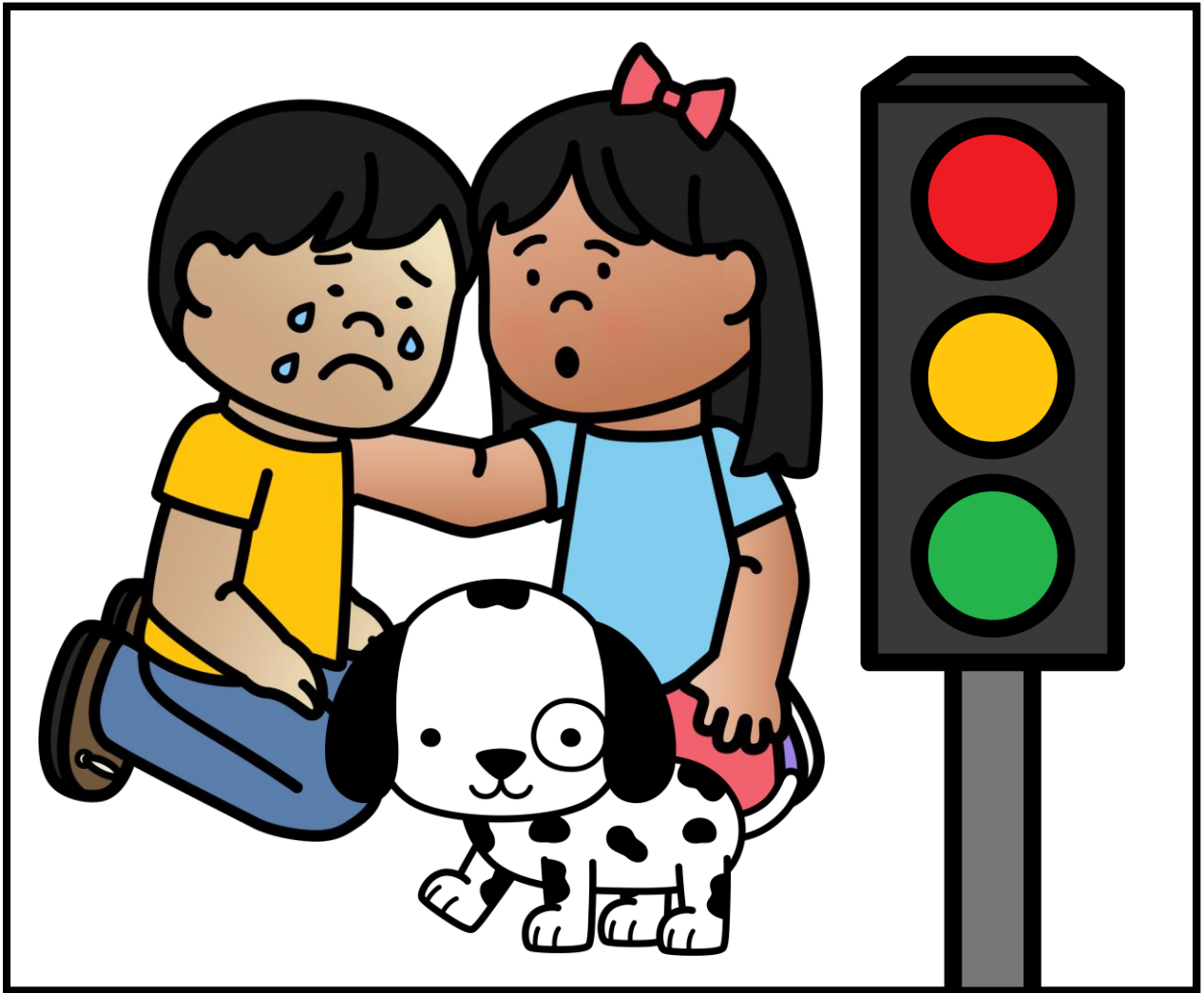
If traffic is moving smoothly, we will work with quiet voices. We will raise our hand for a chance to speak.



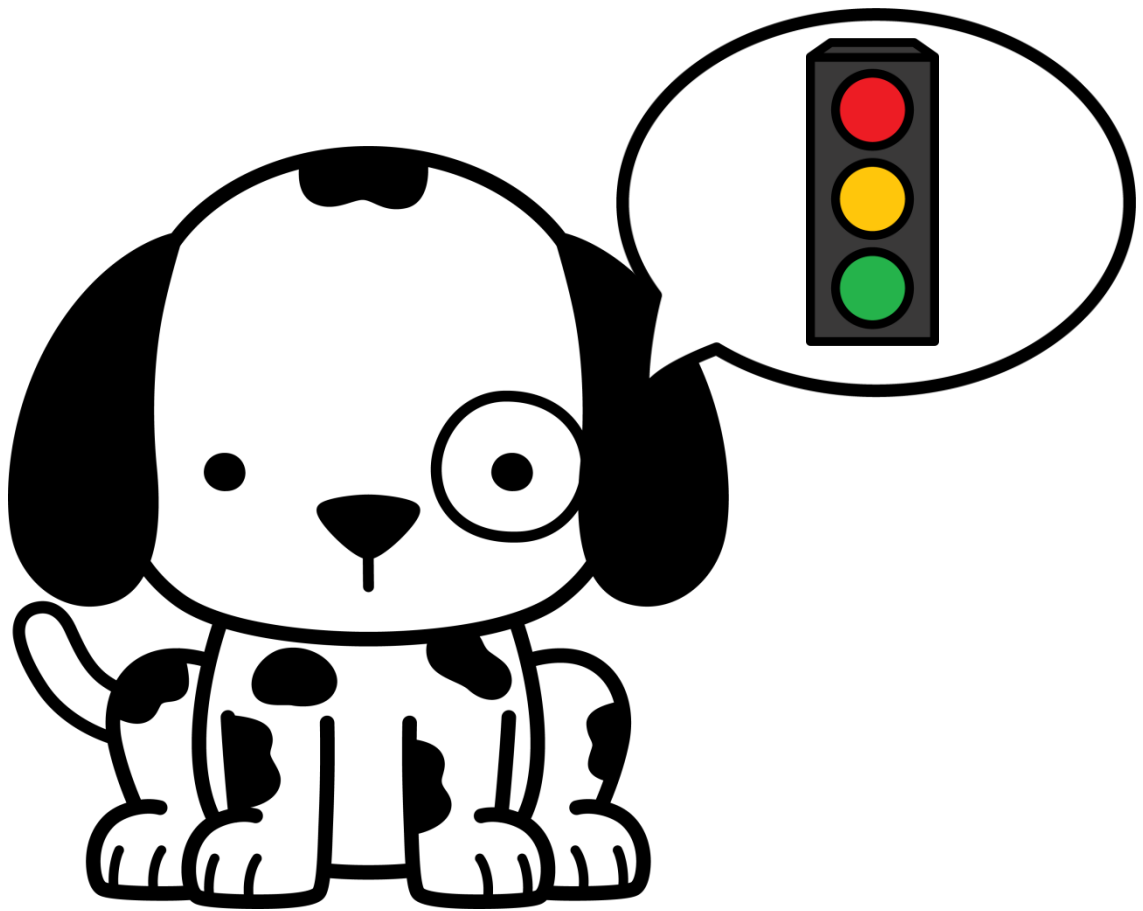
If traffic is moving smoothly, we will share with our friends. We will take turns, listen, and be respectful to friends.

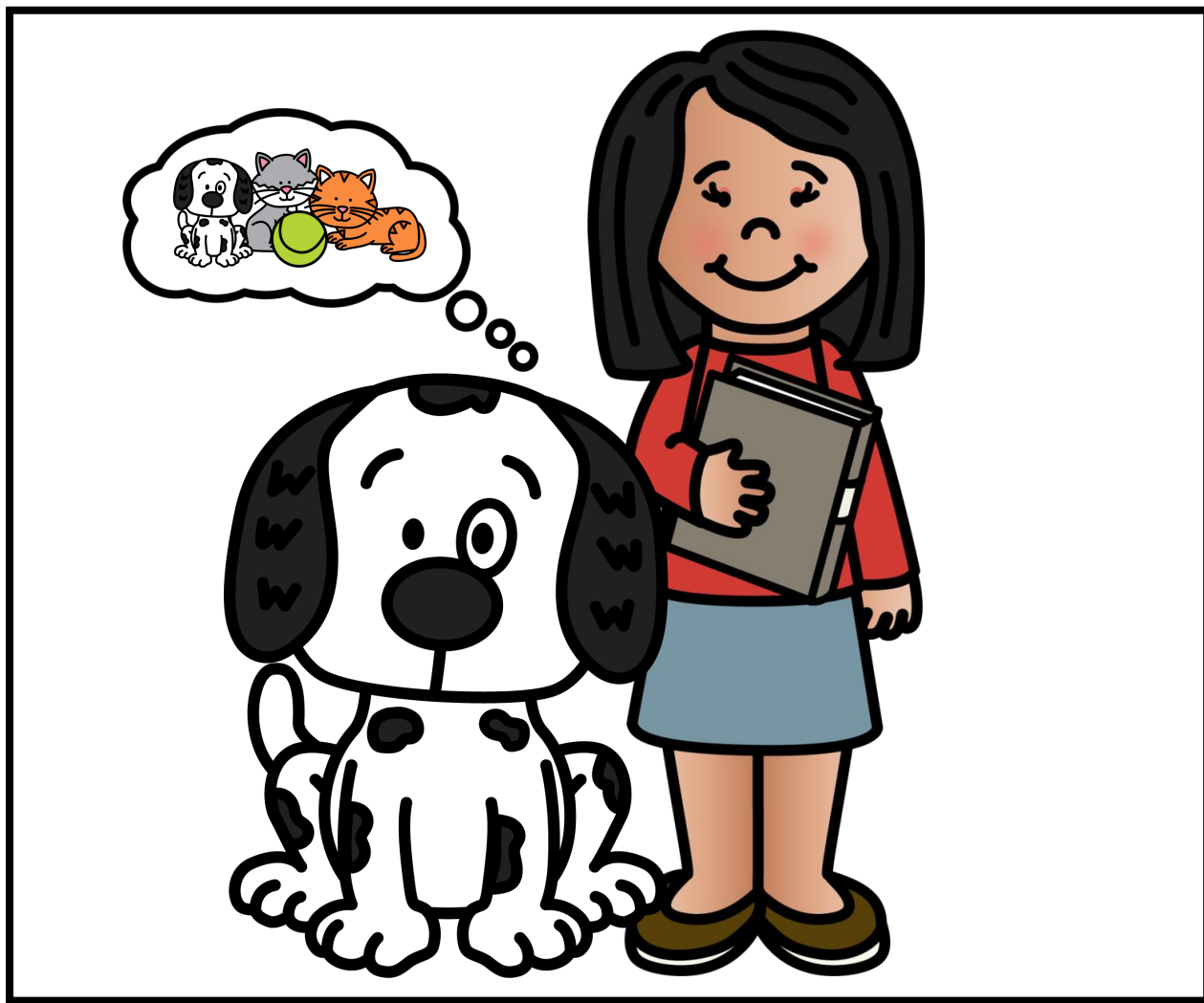
When we tell our teacher something, it's called reporting. We make a report if someone needs help.



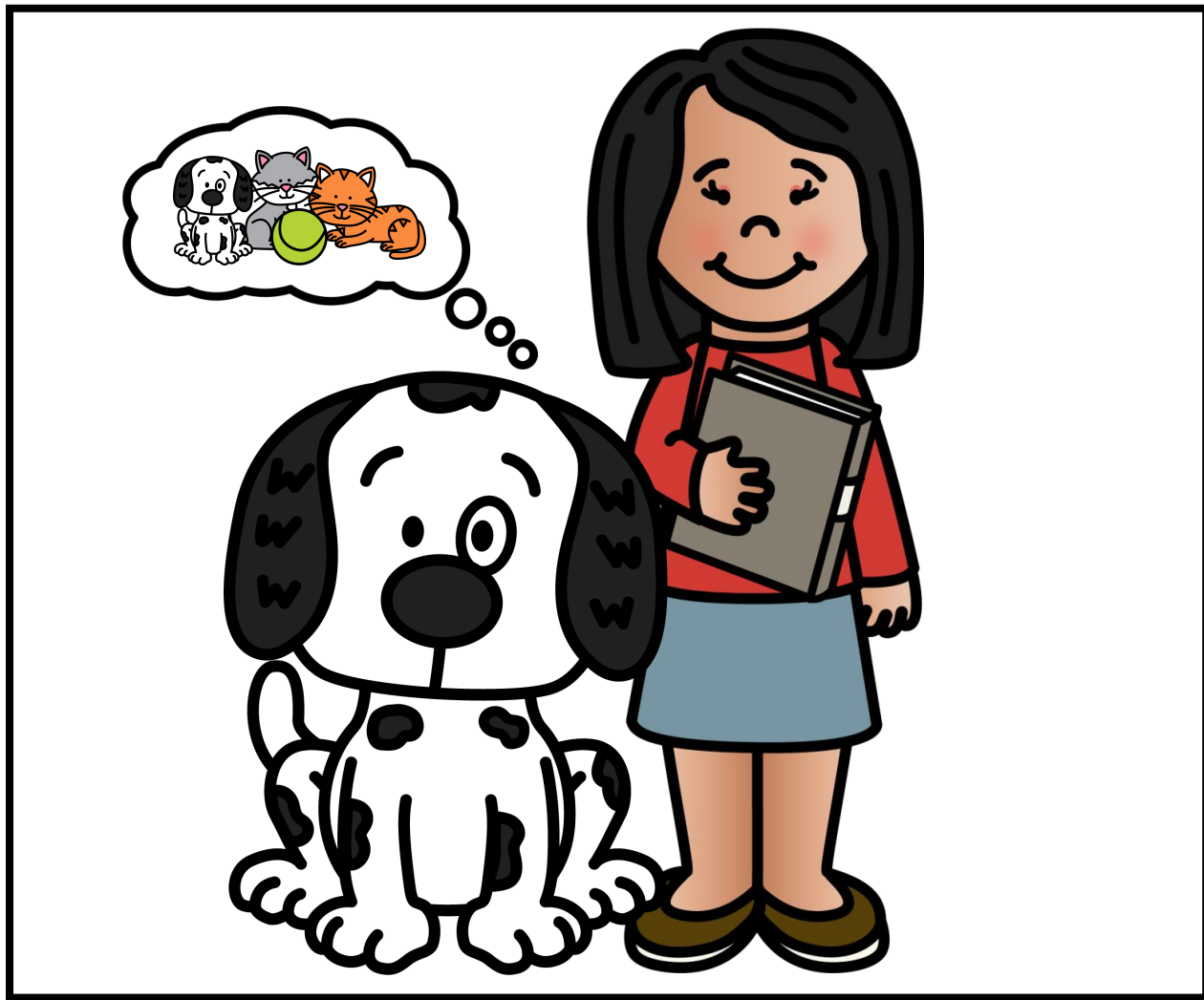

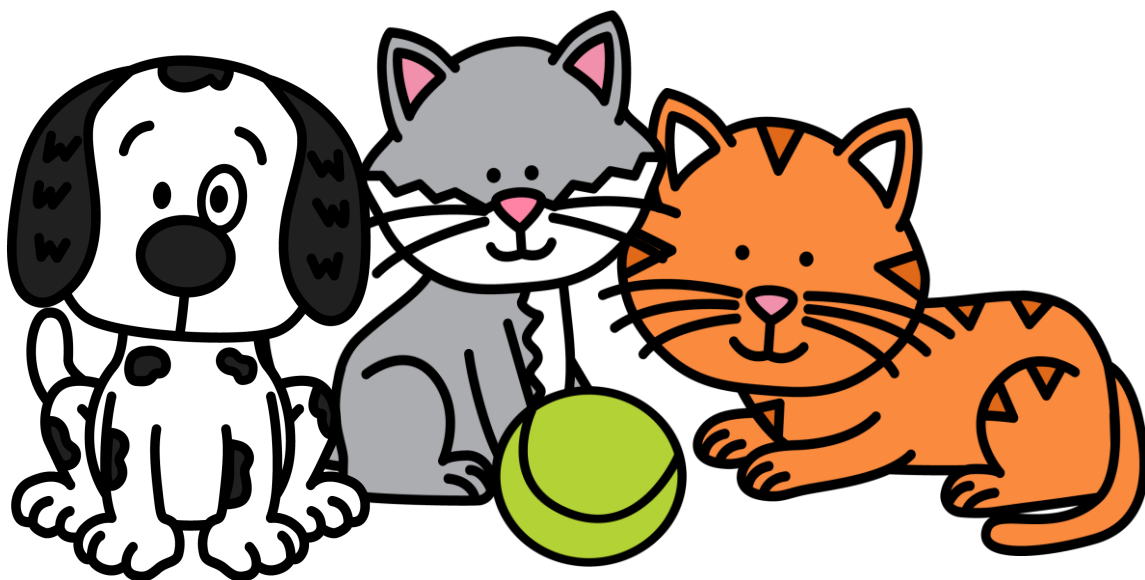
**When we see a problem,

adult-sized problem.**



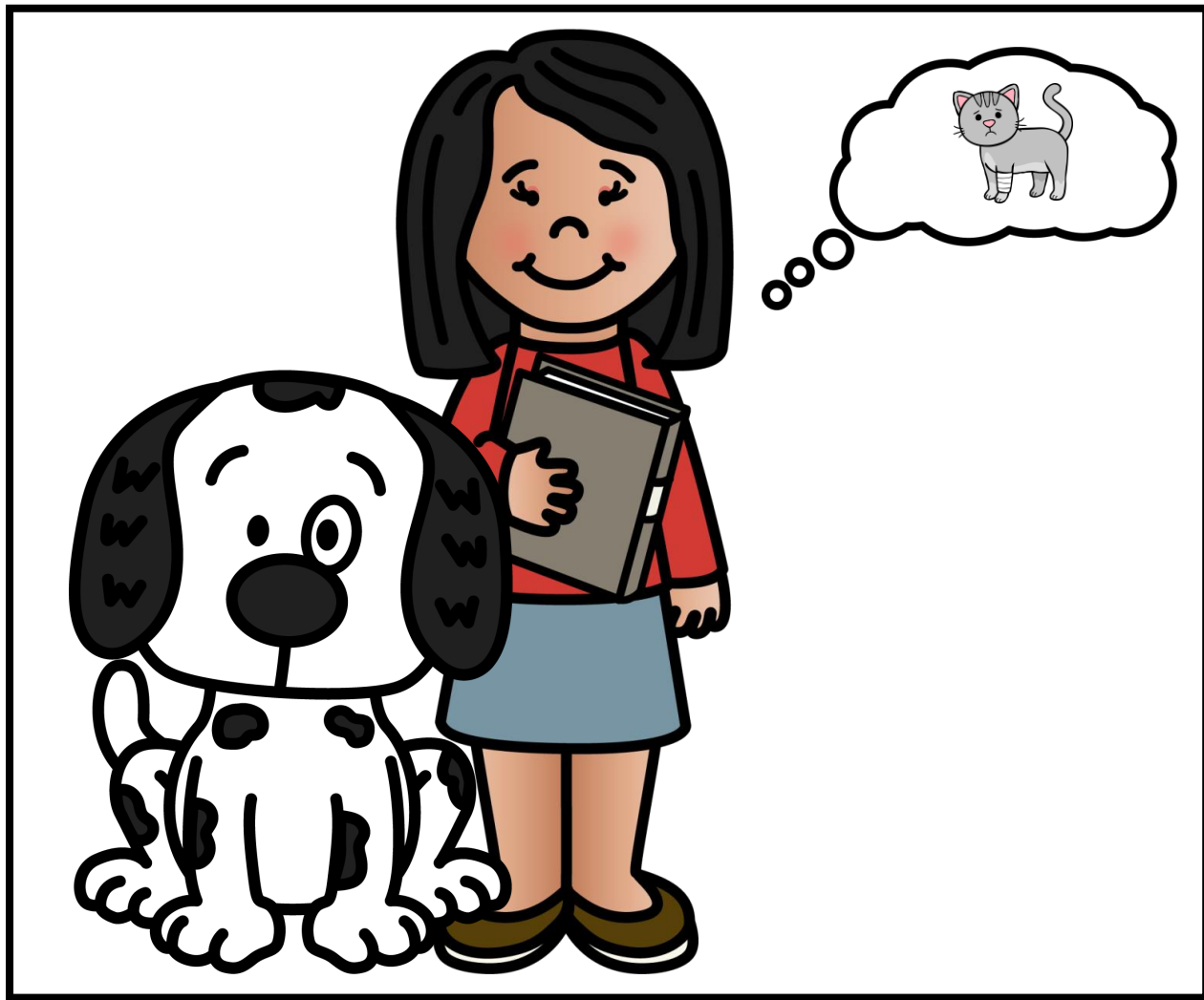
If it's a kid-sized problem, your teacher will ask you to try and solve the issue yourself.

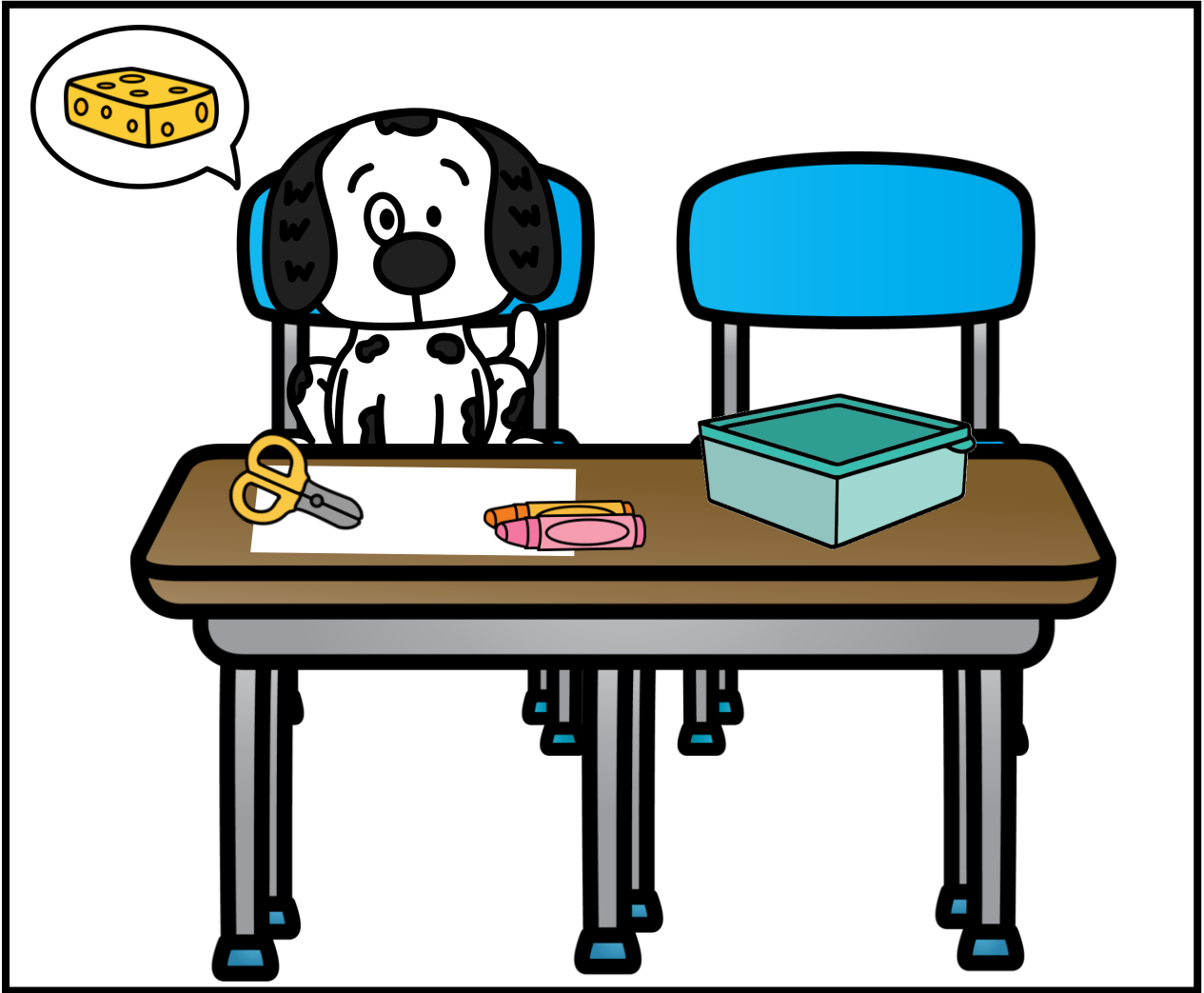




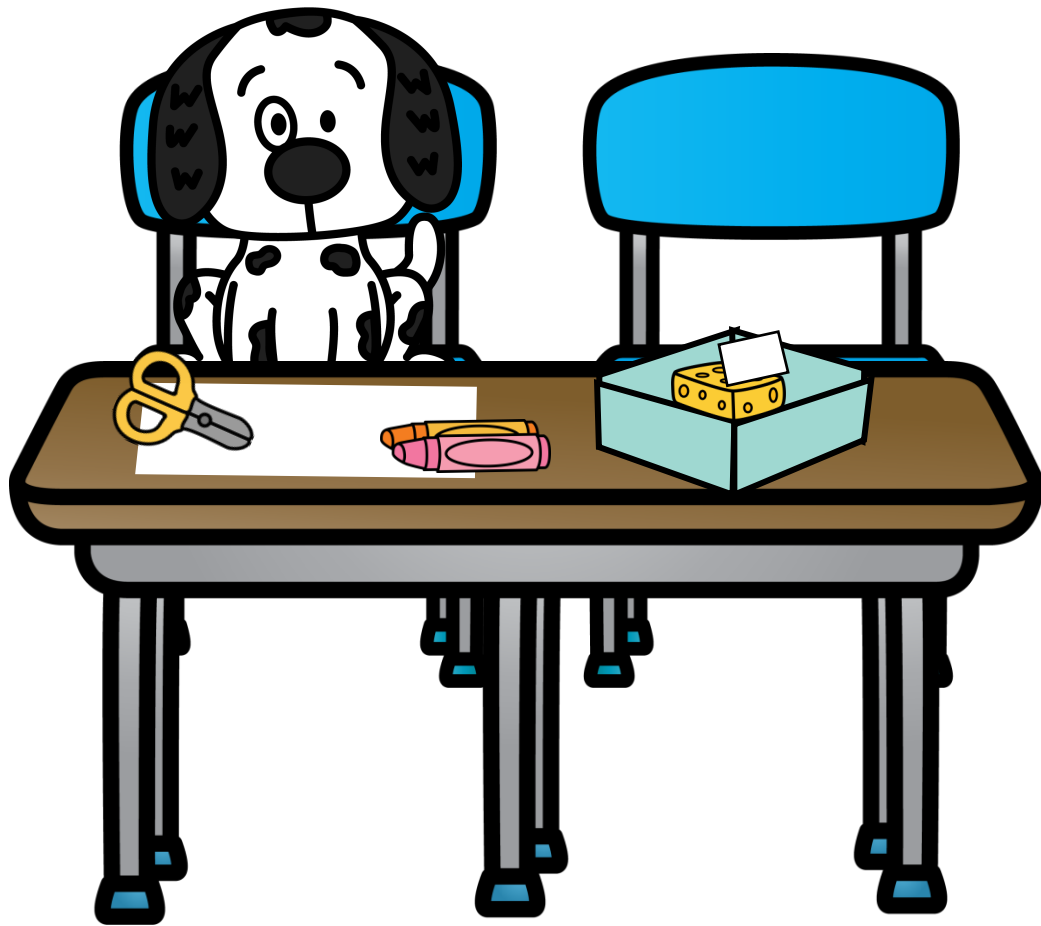
Pip the Pup is working on a craft. Pip the Pup needs glue for her project.



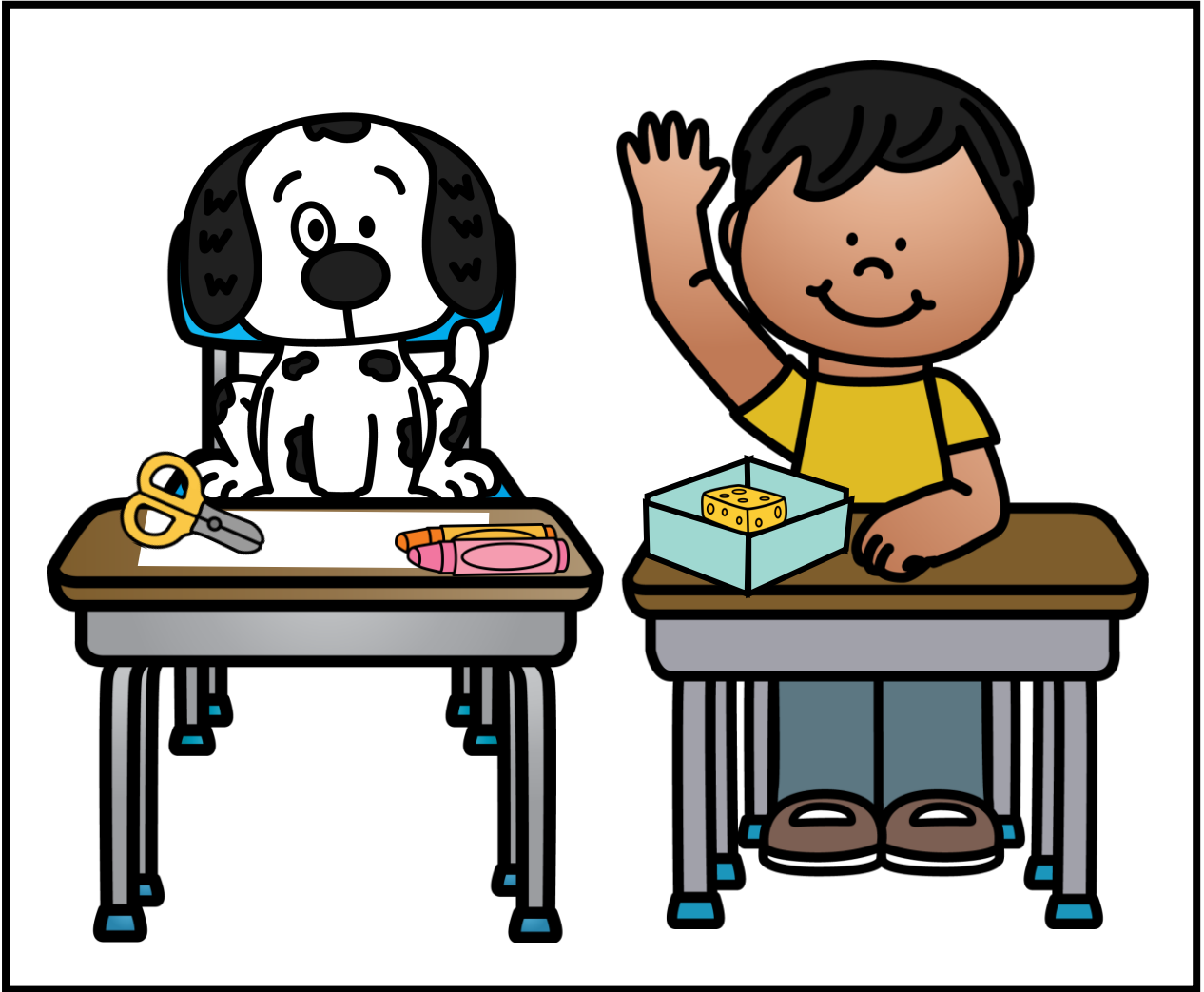
Pip the Pup will use her glue sponge to glue on the pieces. What is a glue sponge?



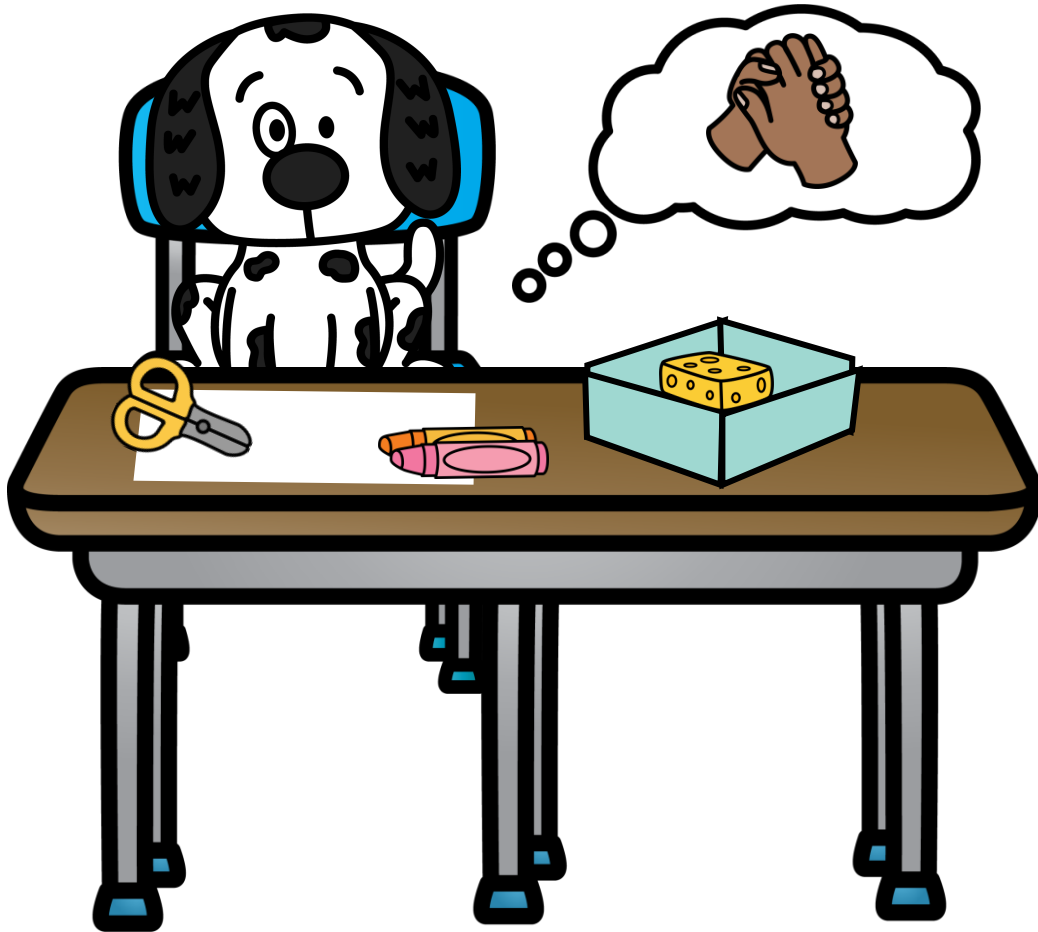
A glue sponge is a really neat way to glue. The glue sponge stays in a container like this.



**We pat our paper onto
the glue sponge. We

out of the container.**



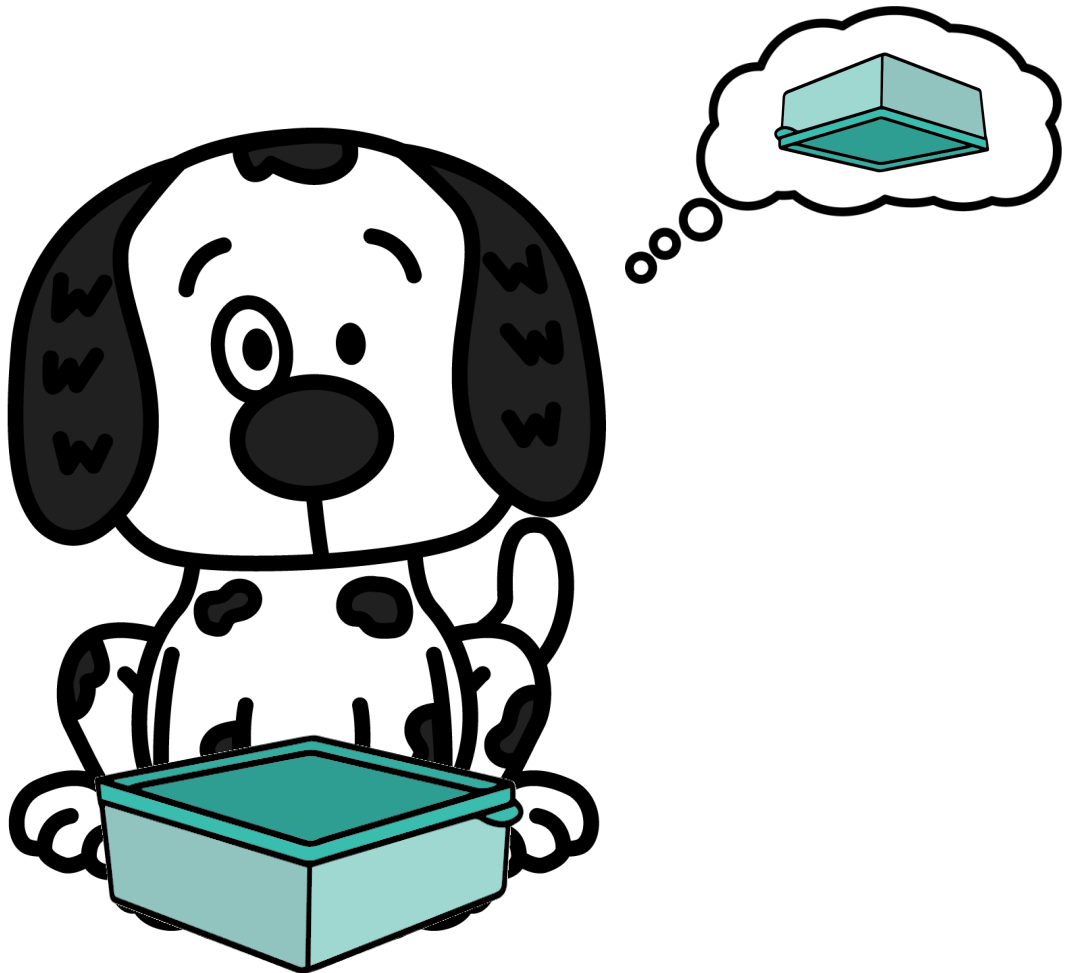
**If our glue sponge
needs to be turned
over we will raise our
hand to ask for help.**



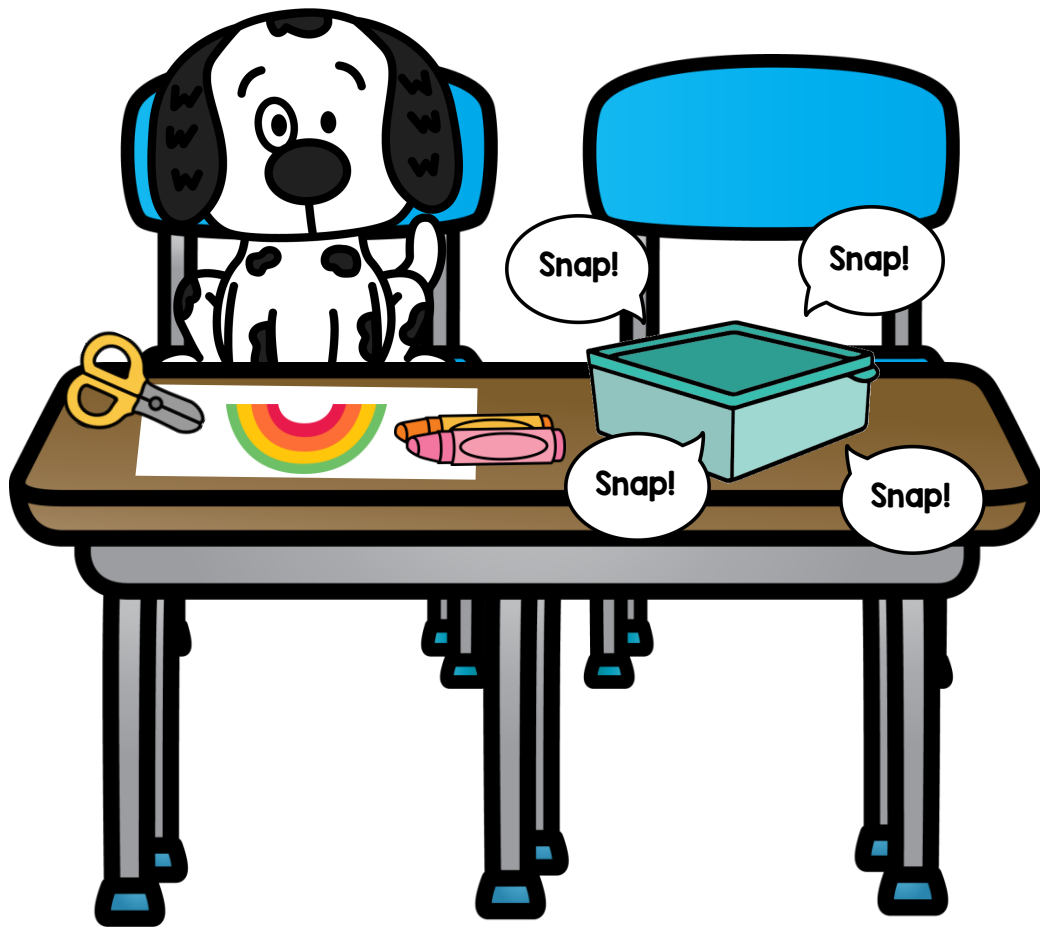
If we get glue on our fingers it's okay. Rub them together and the glue will peel off.



**If we need to carry
the glue sponge we will
hold onto it with two

We never tip the container over, upside down, or twirl it in circles.



**When we are finished
we need to make sure
all four sides of the
container snap close.**



Pip has learned about glue sponges. She is glue sponge certified. Let's get you certified, too!



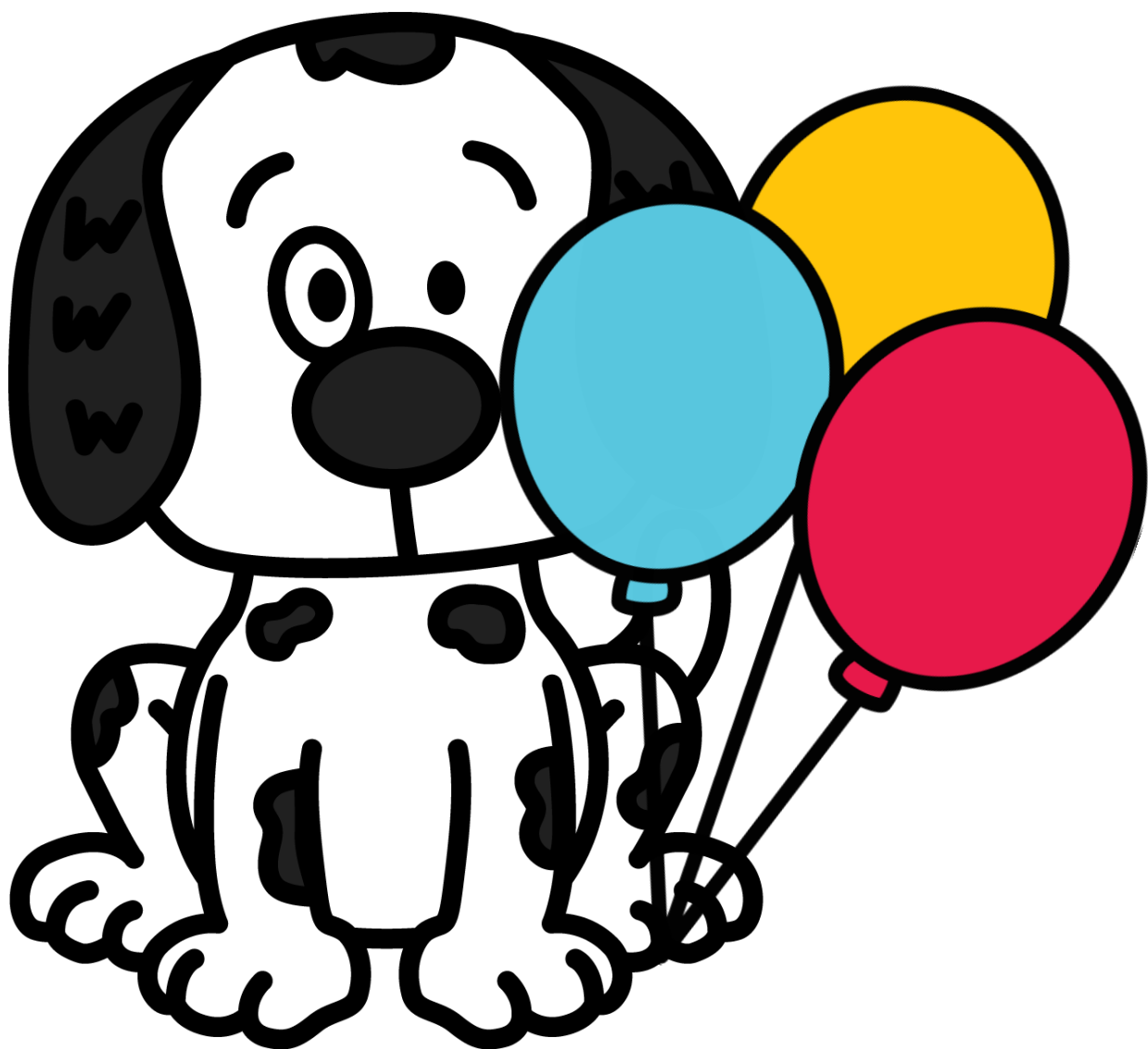

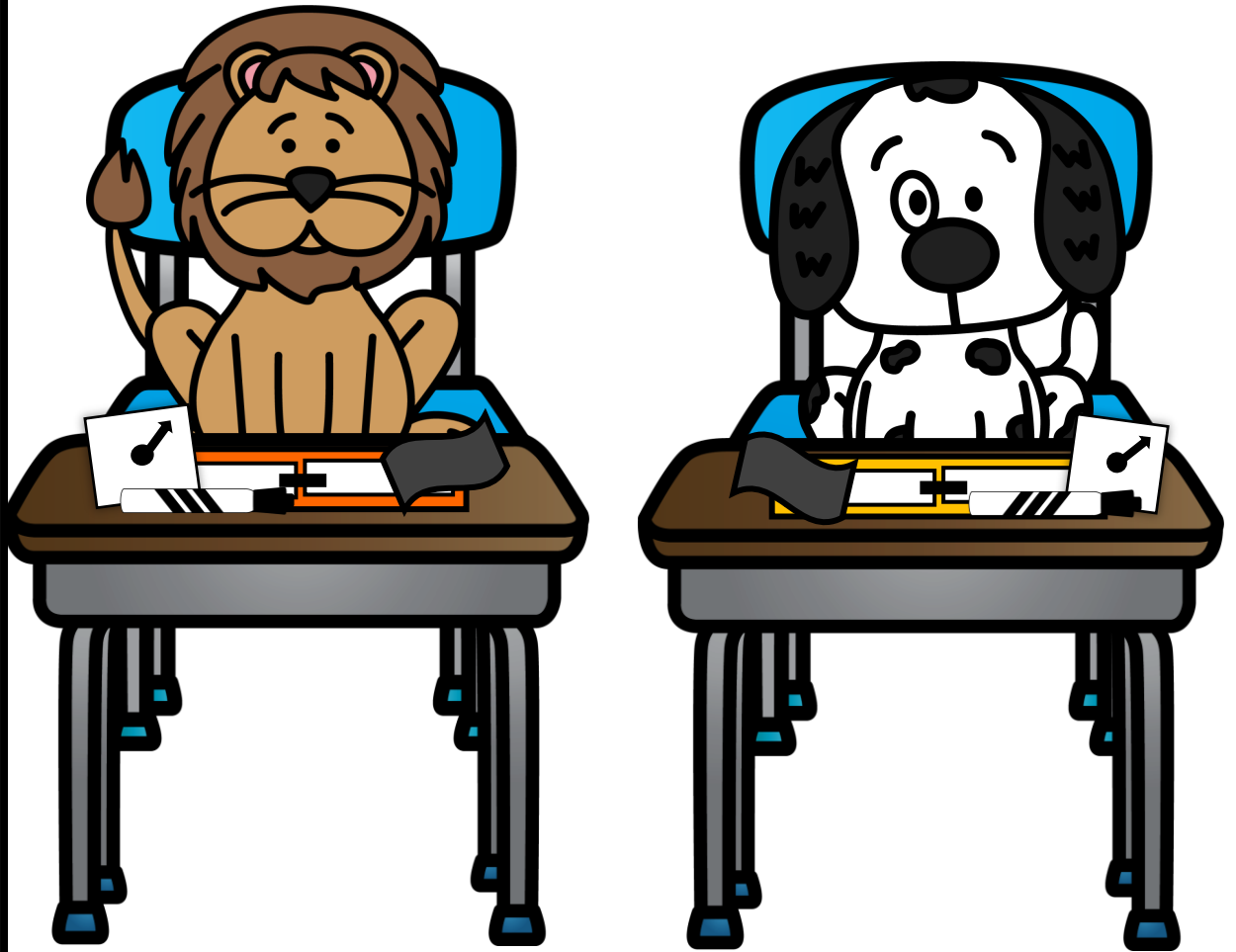




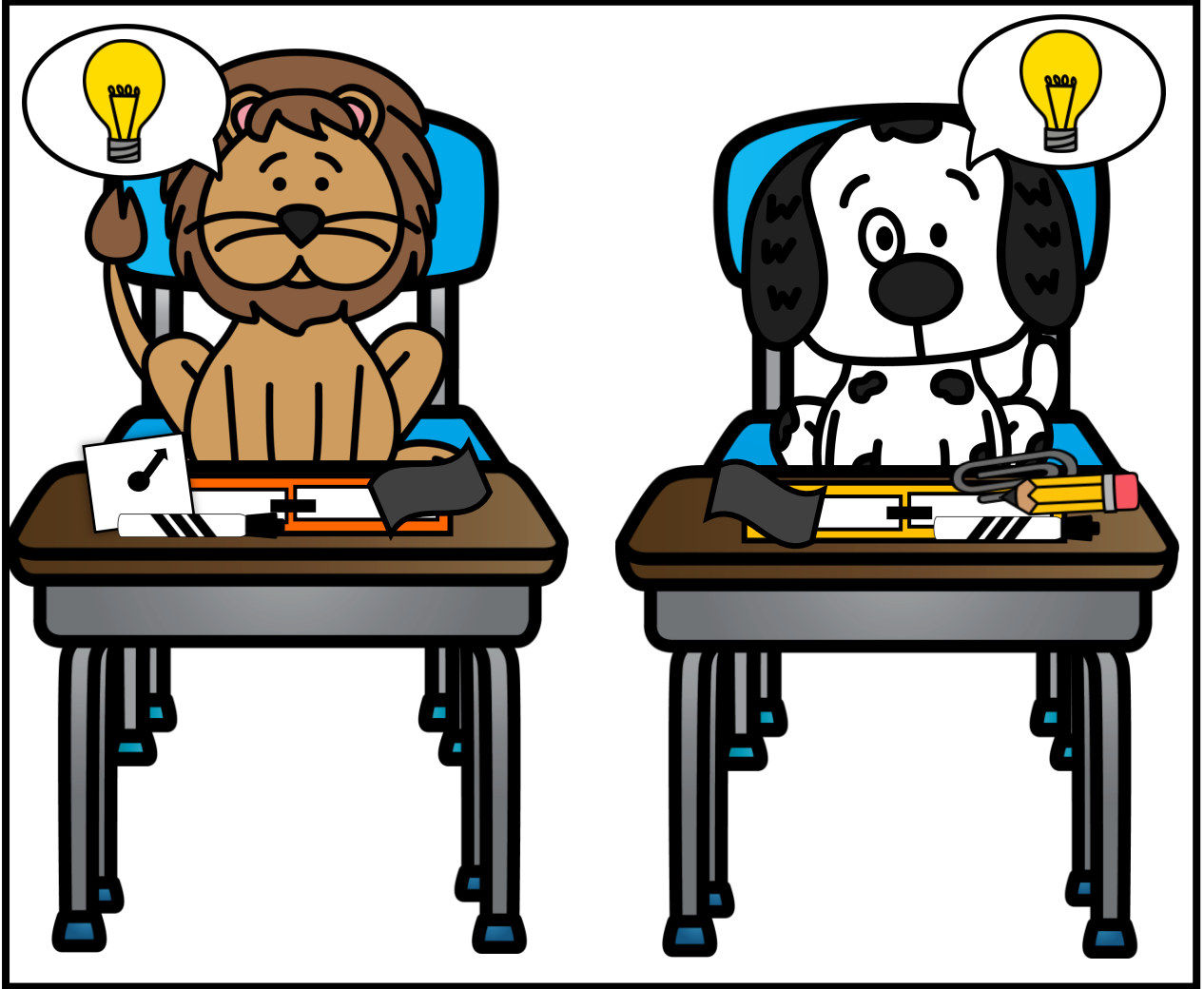
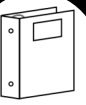
Pip and Levi are ready for center time. They will grab their center time binders.



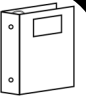
Pip and Levi are binder certified. They want to help you get binder certified, too.



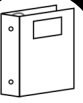
Pip and Levi open their binders and get out their supplies. They grab their marker, spinner, and eraser.



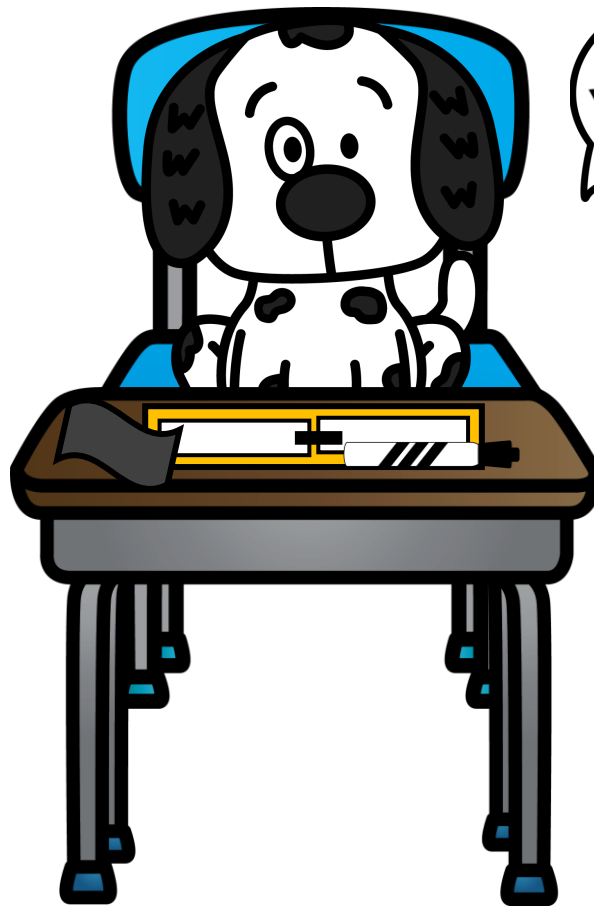
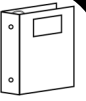
Pip and Levi turn to the first page in their binders and get started learning right away.



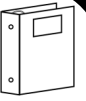
**Pip the Pup says we

cap and pulling hard.**



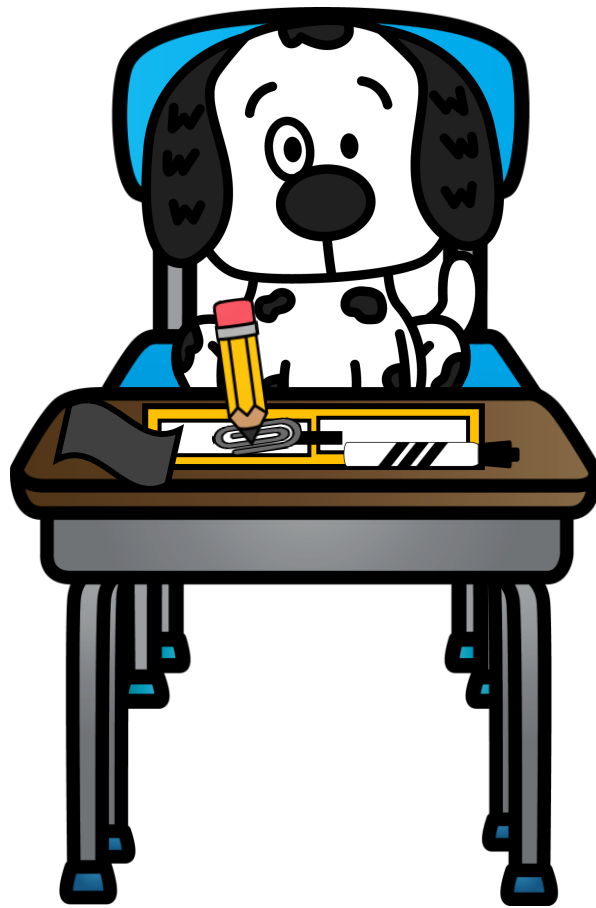
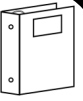
Levi the Lion says when we take the cap off, we place it on the other end so that the lid doesn't get lost.

Levi the Lion says we only use dry erase markers to write with. We never color with dry erase markers.



Pip shows how to spin the spinner the correct way. Hold the pencil straight and flick the spinner.



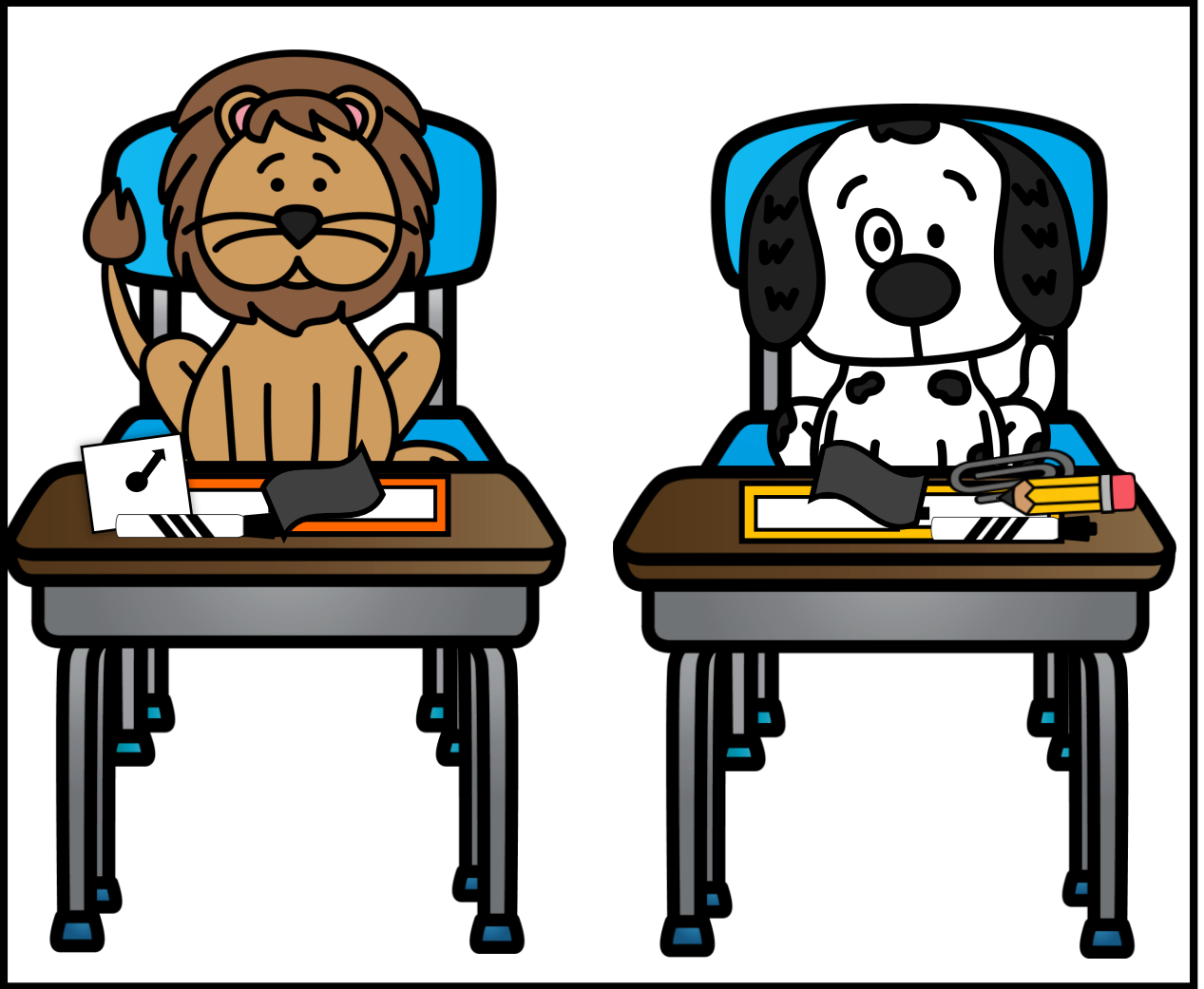
We never push the pencil too hard or it may break. We keep the pencil and paperclip in our workplace.



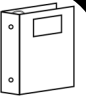
Levi the Lion uses a plastic spinner. He places the spinner on the paper and then flicks the arrow.



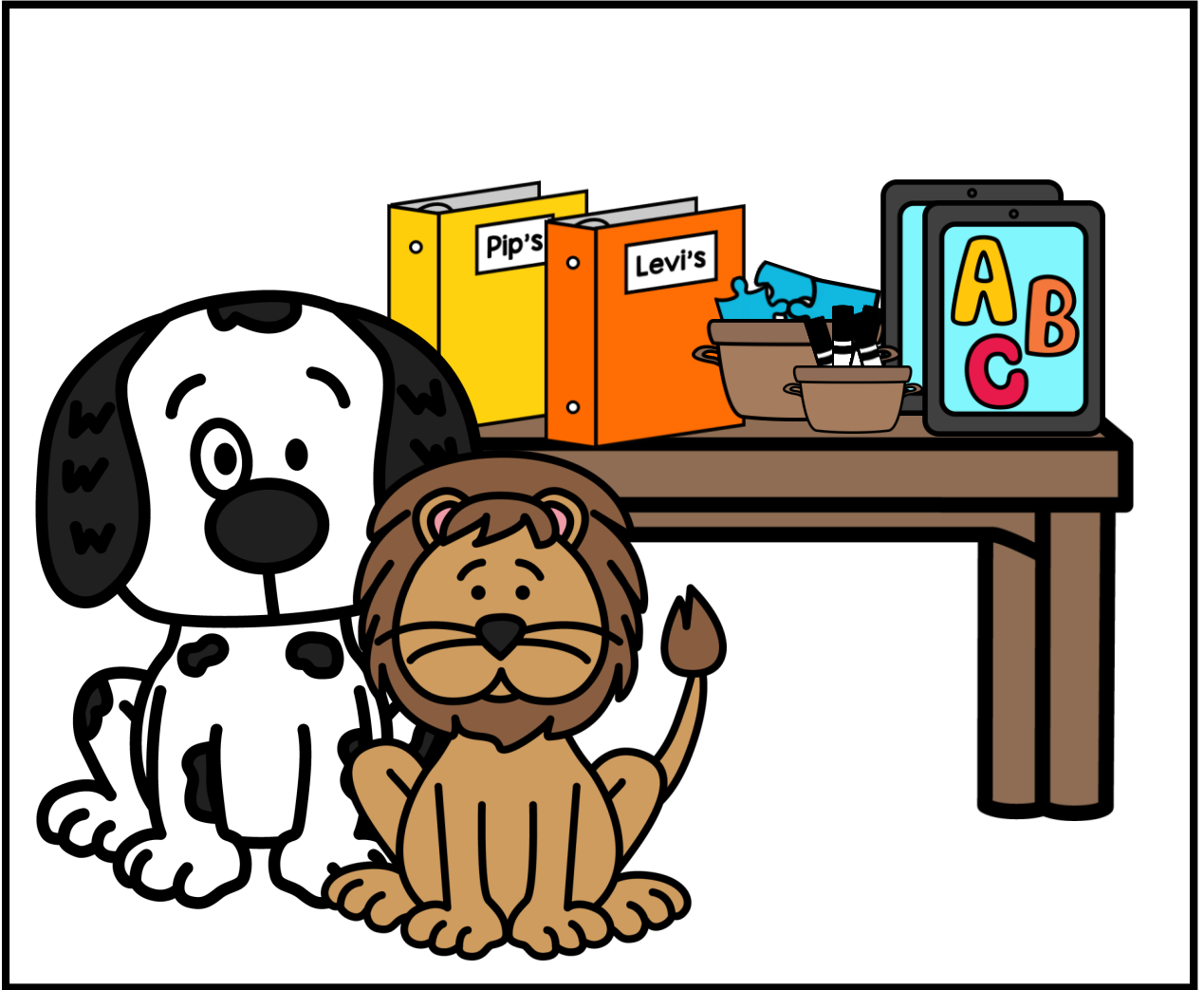
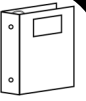
Levi says we never bend, break, or throw the plastic spinner. We only use the spinner for learning.



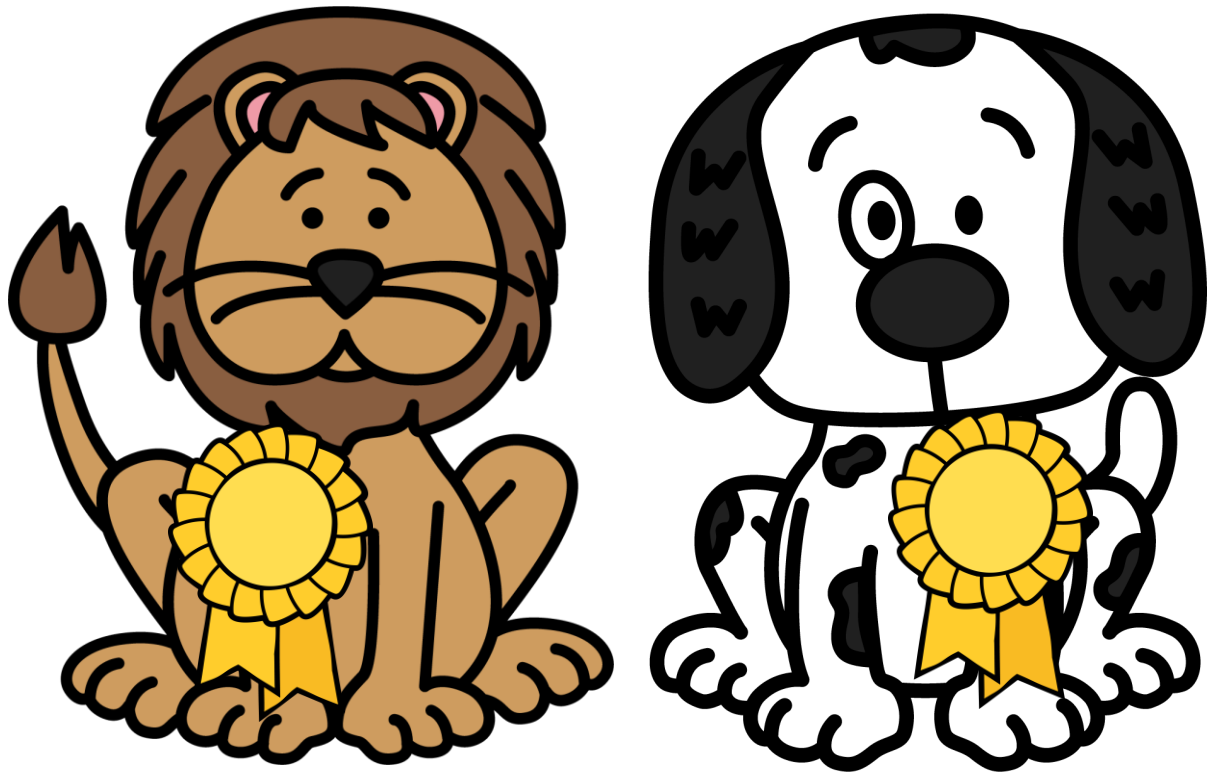
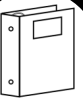
Pip and Levi complete each page in the binder. Before turning to a new page, they erase all the marker off.
