



Decodable Passages





Nonfiction Passages



Nonfiction Passages allows students an opportunity to read and comprehend nonfiction passages. These passages include decodable words, skill vocabulary words, and sight words. Students may respond in one of the two differentiated versions (picture assisted or write-in).
